#### Introduction

Isela Xospa is an independent illustrator, designer, and publisher from Mexico City. Since 2014, she has been the head of Ediciones Xospatronik, an autonomous, independent publishing house for children's literature that foregrounds themes and characters from Milpa Alta, a Nahua region in the south of Mexico City.

She has a degree in Graphic Communication Design from UAM-Xochimilco and a master's degree in Editorial Design and Production from the same university. She has worked for the Fondo de Cultura Económica, ILCE México and the David Bowie Archive. She specializes in character design, visual narrative, self-publishing, and illustration.

Winner of the Antonio García Cubas Award for Best Book and Publishing Work in the field of Anthropology and History in the Children's Book category in 2021 and Artist Book category in 2024.

She actively participates in the exchange of experiences in self-publishing indigenous language books and visual narratives. Her artistic and research work focuses on experimenting with diverse registration systems of native cultures, which she regards as valid processes of learning and transmission of knowledge.

In 2021-2022, she was nominated Chevening British Library Fellow. Her research project focused on the study of early printed books from Latin America, and featured different strategies to make the information about the collection accessible to speakers of native languages, as well as laying the groundwork for future exchange with the British Library.

Her Master's Thesis investigated the phenomenon of self-managed publishing in her hometown, through the detailed analysis of two editorial projects. She emphasized the urgency of strengthening self-managed publishing as a way to preserve and revitalize the ancestral culture of native peoples.
